

Wi-Ne-Ma Christian Camp - RV Area Camping Policies
(Updated January 2017)

Wi-Ne-Ma Christian Camp seeks to serve the Church through programs designed for youth and adults. The Christian camping experience at Wi-Ne-Ma includes youth camps, adult and family conferences, as well as some developed RV and tent camping areas. The following information is designed to help make your stay at Wi-Ne-Ma Christian Camp more in tune with our purpose of proclaiming Christ and encouraging His Church.

1. The camping fee is \$35.00 per night per unit for RV's (trailer, motor home, camper, tent trailer, van for example) and \$25 per night per tent. But tents setting up in an RV space and connecting to water and/or electricity will need to pay the \$35.00 per night rate. Please register and pay at the Camp Office or with the Camp Host in season. Office hours are generally 9:00 am to 5:00 pm Monday through Friday. We are often here on Saturday mornings and Sunday afternoons.
2. Reservations: We do not reserve camping spaces. We also do not "save spaces." For "first come-first serve" a physical presence is required to register for a campsite; meaning the person who is to occupy the site must be present with his or her camping unit, ready to physically occupy the site. You may call ahead to let us know you are coming or to ask which spaces are currently open.
3. Camping spaces are restricted to the North RV area. Contact the office or the Camp Host for specific locations. PLEASE NOTE: To accommodate as many RV's as possible, we try to place two rigs between each service. If your awning, slide out, separate canopy, or tow(ed) vehicle interferes with putting another RV beside you, you will be asked to retract or remove them to get another RV in. Be good neighbors and keep your campsite neat, clean, and orderly.
4. Camping spaces will accommodate one camping unit and one operational tow vehicle.
 - a. A camping unit is defined as any unit that is used for sleeping, such as a motorhome, 5th wheel, tent, camper van, pickup with canopy or camper. Note: if it has wheels it is an RV. RV includes pop up tent campers and vehicles.
 - b. An operational tow vehicle is either a vehicle being towed or the vehicle towing the camping unit.
 - c. Vehicles other than the operational tow vehicles are considered extra vehicles and must pay the extra vehicle fee (\$5 per day). If a vehicle is towed in by a RV then it is not considered an extra vehicle. At the discretion of the Camp Host or Camp Office, you may be required to park your tow vehicle at a designated location.
5. Pets Not Allowed. Contact the Camp Office for list of area boarding facilities.
6. Please use the Patience Hall restrooms as your primary toilet facilities.
7. When Youth Camps are in Session – June-August and when Guest Groups are using the facilities.
 - a. RV and tent campers are not to be in the youth camp area. We run closed camps. You may not walk through the main camp area or use Camp facilities (boats, slide, playground, camp buildings for example. Visitor passes are required to interact with the Camp in session.
 - b. RV and tent campers have use of the showers between 9:00 am and Noon. Only the Morse Lodge showers are open to RV and tent campers.
 - c. Do not use the Morse Lodge rest rooms when the Youth Camp is in the Bonfire Area – 8:00 pm – 10:00 pm.
 - d. Please know that our priority is to provide a quality Christian camping experience for the youth in our care. Please help us in keeping the youth camp's focus on Jesus Christ during their time here.

- e. These restrictions also apply when there are groups renting the Camp's buildings.
8. RV and tent campers may use the lake approach on the east side of the lake to put private non-motor boats in the lake when Youth Campers are not using the lake.
 9. Be careful with fires. Use only designated fire pits. Do not make your own campfire area. Stay out of the dune grass and driftwood when you build fires on the beach. Do not leave fires unattended.
 10. Observe quiet time from 10:00 pm to 8:00 am.
 11. No skate boards, bicycles, roller blades in camp.
 12. No alcohol, marijuana, illegal drugs, tobacco products, vaping, or firearms in Camp.
 13. Watch the tides and use the beach safely. Use caution with the ocean.
 14. Camper Stay Limits: Maximum stay is not to exceed 21 consecutive days. You must go out for at least 7 nights. NOTE: Public camping is not allowed during the scheduled family camps and conferences.
 15. Additional restrictions may be applied as needed at the discretion of the Camp Manager.
